I just read an article about a Catholic African American farming family in Louisiana. The family had been stymied by their local bank in obtaining timely crop loans. Even the local branch of the United States Department of Agriculture could not be of help. Unfortunately, the family lost their farm to foreclosure in what appears to be discrimination.
