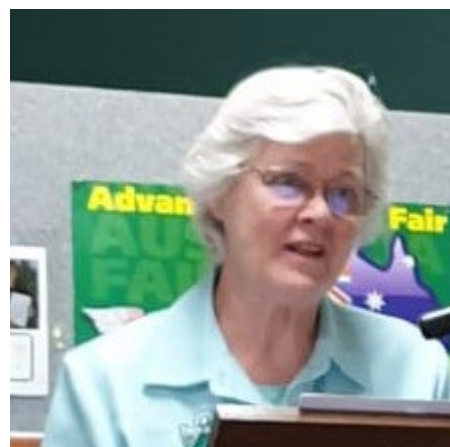
Steering the ELSPM ship through the stormy waters of the past semester has not been easy. The pressure of lockdowns increased, technical problems abounded, and the sheer isolation of learning through a computer in one's room at home, took its toll on everyone. We all ducked last Monday when an earthquake hit Indonesia and Krisna disappeared off the screen, under his desk and Gusti disappeared completely. We rejoiced when Sawako gave us a bird's eye view of the Olympics in Tokyo and when Eileen captured the early morning rainbows in Melbourne. We prayed and cried together as Sheikh buried 29 of his parishioners in one month because of Covid. We marked vaccinations days and sympathised with each other's sore arms and headaches. Our world became smaller as we checked the weather each day in all the locations our students zoomed in from. What held us together was the common goal to get through, to succeed, and there was also lots and lots of laughter. Sometimes from the mistakes we made in English but more often from the sheer joy of being together.

In July we received a substantial Government grant to help with digital technology. It has been a demanding 5 months of meetings, planning and purchasing and it is with only a little trepidation that I can announce ELSPM has entered the digital world of education with some amazing new equipment – touch screens, laptops, iPads and videoing equipment. All very well, but what will really make the difference will be our ability to reach students outside our time zone and provide remote online courses both in English for Academic Purposes and short courses for those in Ministry.
