Solar Panels: Living into the Laudato Sí Action Platform...



Thanks to a generous anonymous donor, 45 solar panels have been installed on the carport at Sacred Heart Monastery in Louisville, Kentucky. Local Superior, John Monzyk, CP, was amazed at what only one hour of full sunshine could accomplish through these panels—the Monastery's back-up batteries were fully charged!


The panels are a visible witness of our Passionist Congregation's commitment to the *Laudato Sí Action Platform*, inaugurated by the Vatican in 2021. The panels will contribute to keeping carbon pollution out of the atmosphere by reducing the amount of electricity which must be generated by fossil fuels for the Monastery's consumption.

The benefit of the solar panels and the back-up batteries, is that the Monastery will have a reliable source of back-up emergency power in case of a power failure of the municipal utility.

There are many other ways we can lower our carbon footprints.

Passionist Alumni...A Force for Good...

When Passionist Alumnus Jack Dermody heard the Passionist Sisters at Colegio Guadalupe Pasionista in Agua Prieta, Mexico, needed a new roof, he sprang into action!

Between December 10, 2021 and February 13, 2022, Jack spearheaded a drive to raise funds with a goal of \$15,000 to help the Passionist Sisters fix the roof for Colegio Guadalupe Pasionista in Agua Prieta, Mexico. Thanks, once again, to the generosity of our Passionist Alumni, the projected goal was far exceeded. A few individuals also donated time and expenses beyond the financial goal. After the payouts to our football grand champion and a few fees to the GoFundMe site, our Passionist Sisters across the border have received over \$19,000!

Similar to the bicycle race held last year to raise funds for Hugo Esparza-Pérez, CP's, food ministry in Haiti, the Agua Prieta mission began on December 10 with a bicycle race. On a national launch via Zoom, alumnus Bob Duffield started everyone off in front of the San Diego Mission. Fourteen alumni walked, ran, or bicycled 552 miles in their hometowns as they completed a virtual pilgrimage from San Diego to Agua Prieta. Mike Kruger covered all of the website fees and he created over 20 postcards that described the historic missions we passed and much more. These alumni and their friends got the team halfway to the goal.

Clemente Barrón, CP, spoke to his brother Passionists in the Community at Mater Dolorosa, and said "the community had been blessed with some funds over the last year and they loved the idea of contributing it to their counterparts—the Passionist Sisters—just across the border."

Super Bowl Weekend gave some of the Alumni the perfect opportunity to gather friends and contribute additional support for the Passionist Sisters. Jack and Rose Dermody hosted a house party with in-person and Zoom guests from around the country. The in-person and online guests enjoyed a riveting presentation by the Sisters, interpreted by Alfredo Ocampo, CP, and comedy stand-up by none other than alumnus Ray Alonzo. The guests themselves raised over \$2,000 that night and were matched by an anonymous alumnus from Ohio. Carl DeLage's party, victim of a COVID lockdown, collected \$500 from friends who were unable to be at the DeLage home in person.

Vowed Passionists were the big stars on Zoom. John Schork, CP, co-hosted and kept people entertained. Alfredo Ocampo, CP, interpreted between the Sisters and their audiences. Finally, the Sisters themselves shared an inspiring and motivating PowerPoint presentation. It became easy to want to help them out.
